Social Change is a ubiquitous phenomenon. Every community within the society undergoes changes in social as well as cultural aspects. If we look at the changes occurred in recent decades, we will find that there have been numerous changes. One of the significant factors of these changes is the technological advancement and digitization. Today, billions of people throughout the world use Information and Communication Technology (ICT). And the significance and contributions of the ICT in the lives of human beings have widely

been accepted. Individuals, organizations and communities have been greatly benefited by https://genulantolestech/T and the resultant advancement in socio-cultural life of people.

As the rate and pace of social change vary across society, the population with access to ICT also widely varies across the globe. A research report published by an international study showed that about 80 percent of the populations in the "developed" nations have access to the ICT facilities while in case of "developing" nations, the statistics is only about 38 percent in the year 2015. Although the development in ICT is comparatively low in case of developing counties, there has been many initiatives post 2015. Countries like Malaysia, Singapore and India have greatly been progressed in this sector. With these developments, the concept of "Smart Cities" has been envisioned and programs are being initiated in many counties. Basically, smart city denotes the idea of urban development where technology is integrated with various dimensions of development for the smart operation. It includes an integrated approach; combining social, environmental, economic, governance, infrastructural and information aspects integrate together to connect citizens to any type of services in an efficient manner.

Following the same principle, the Government of Nepal (GoN) also has envisioned the concept of smart cities as a rural -urban linkage with a view of creating cities as a center of economic growth. According to the plan and policy of fiscal year 2073-2074 (2016-2017) three municipalities Palungtar, Lumbini and Nijgadh have been proposed to be developed as the smart cities. In case of Nepal, smart cities have been conceptualized as having four characteristics; namely - Smart People, Smart Governance, Smart Infrastructures, and Smart Economy.
